January - 16 days when the temperature failed to reach 0°C and there was a 3cm covering of snow on 13th.

February - high winds and storm `Doris`

March - hail on 5 March followed by a long spell of sunny and dry days resulting in a very low rainfall total for the month.

April - 16 consecutive dry days, many of which were sunny

May – unfortunately we were away for the hottest 8 days, so only the maximum temperature recorded for this period

June – 13 consecutive dry days and a clear, sunny spell mid month. (July should see higher temperatures)
